

# Updates to COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility Requirements

Effective April 1, more California residents can be vaccinated



- Persons ages 65 and older
- Sector groups
  - Health care workers
  - Long-term care residents
  - Education and childcare
- Persons ages 16 and older with one of the following high-risk medical conditions or disabilities are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine.
  - Cancer, current with weakened immune system.
  - Chronic kidney disease, stage 4 or above.
  - Chronic pulmonary disease, oxygen dependent.
  - Down syndrome.
  - Solid organ transplant, leading to a weakened immune system.
  - Pregnancy.
  - Sickle cell disease.
  - Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease or cardiomyopathies (but not hypertension).
  - Severe obesity (Body Mass Index  $\ge$  40 kg/m<sup>2</sup>).
  - Type 2 diabetes mellitus with a hemoglobin A1c level greater than 7.5%.

OR if, as a result of a developmental or other significant high-risk disability, one or more of the following criteria applies:

- A COVID-19 infection is likely to result in severe life-threatening illness or death.
- Getting COVID-19 will limit the person's ability to receive ongoing care or services vital to their well-being and survival.
- Providing adequate and timely COVID-19 care will be particularly challenging as a result of the individual's disability.

### Coverage for every stage of life™



#### Proof for high-risk conditions or disabilities

- Residents are not required to provide documentation of high-risk medical conditions and/or disabilities.
- 2 Residents **are required** to sign a self-attestation that they meet the criteria for the high-risk medical conditions and/or disabilities outlined on page 1.

#### AS OF APRIL 1, 2021

All individuals age 50 or older are eligible for vaccination.

#### AS OF APRIL 15, 2021

**Every California resident age 16 or older** is eligible for vaccination.
