MEDI-CAL EXPANSION

Access to Medi-Cal Coverage will Expand in 2024

On January 1, 2024, California will allow adults ages 26 through 49 to enroll in full-scope Medi-Cal, no matter their immigration status. All other Medi-Cal eligibility rules, including income limits, will still apply.

This new age guideline follows expansion for young adults 19 through 25 and adults 50 years of age and older.

An application for Medi-Cal will not affect immigration status, nor chances of permanent residency or citizenship. The Plan does not collect or report immigration status information.

REDETERMINATION

New Resources Available to Keep Millions of Medi-Cal Members Covered

Medi-Cal members need to review their information and renew their coverage

You now have the opportunity to share helpful redetermination-related resources from the Plan with Medi-Cal members and their families. Check out the toolkits which include flyers, draft social media content, frequently asked questions (FAQs) and more on the [Bridging the Divide website](#).

The redetermination-related materials are also available in Spanish, Chinese, Arabic and other languages. Medi-Cal members and their families can be alerted about coverage updates through:

- **Email templates** – Send emails directly to members using sample messages.
- **Web language** – Update your website to help direct current Medi-Cal members to the right place to confirm their eligibility.
- **Social media graphics and suggested copy** – Post to your social media platforms to inform about and provide guidance on how to take action to avoid coverage disruption.
- **Digital flyers** – Flyers are available to print and share with members at events, on resource tables, in waiting rooms and in exam rooms.
- **FAQs** – Provide quick answers to common questions from members about the redetermination process, how to update contact information and more.

California Department of Health Care Services Releases Online Medi-Cal Enrollment Dashboard

An interactive [Medi-Cal Continuous Coverage Unwinding Dashboard](#) is now live! The dashboard is brimming with redetermination insights into enrollments, applications and more. Examples include:

- **June 2023 stats:** 15.6 million enrolled, 143,069 new applications, 53,836 new enrollments. 1,051,400 members due for redetermination, 81% complied.
- **Expected June disenrollment rate:** 17%, lower than pre-COVID-19. Disenrolled members can reinstate until September 30.
- **Expanded coverage:** Efforts continue, as 700,000+ individuals joined in January, for enrollment regardless of immigration status.

The Source LGBT+ Center Celebrates Renovation and Expansion

Health Net grant provides more space for Center visitors

The Source LGBT+ Center recently opened its newly renovated location, which includes an interior redesign and courtyard expansion. A **\$50,000 grant** from Health Net helped provide a place for more than 3,000 annual visitors to:

- Gather for events
- Learn about resources
- Find a safe space to express themselves

The Source moved into its own building in October 2021, with nearly 5,000 square feet of space for support groups, client services, youth, volunteers and staff. The organization recently celebrated seven years of service to Tulare, Kings and Fresno County residents.

“Health Net is proud to support The Source in its work to create a safe space for all LGBTQ+ individuals,” said Nai Kasick, vice president, Medi-Cal regional lead at Health Net. “We are excited to see residents use the new space and to witness how it will create a stronger, more connected community in Central California.”¹

“I’m honored to be part of the story of The Source and to see us grow from an idea to owning a campus in Downtown Visalia,” said Nick Vargas, co-founder and director of development at The Source. “The investment from our community partners, donors, and especially Health Net, has made it possible to have a space that our community can call home.”²

More Homeless Californians to Find Housing and Social Services Thanks to Health Net’s \$46 Million in Grants

In July, Health Net announced that the company will award **more than \$46 million in grants** to support California’s unhoused Medi-Cal members through housing and other supportive services. Twenty-six counties across California will receive funds to support local Continuum of Care (CoC) programs and other housing services agencies to help California’s most vulnerable residents. A CoC is a regional or local planning body that coordinates housing and other services for families and individuals experiencing homelessness.

Grant funds will be used to:

- **Increase partnerships** and local capacity of organizations to support referrals for services.
- **Improve the infrastructure** used to coordinate and meet the needs for members seeking housing.
- **Enhance service delivery** and member engagement for those at-risk of or who are currently homeless.
